A Message from Ms. Boyle



On day two we visited many historical monuments, the White House, the Capitol, the U.S. Botanical Gardens, and the Newseum.



Day four we hit the road to head home after breakfast at our hotel.

















Also this week, Grades 4 and 5 played the role of designers in Art class. Their assignment was to design and construct a shoe. They began by drafting their shoe, which could be any style from a sandal, or a high-heel, to a high-top sneaker, or a platform boot and everything in between. After showing me their sketch, they had access to card board paper, newspaper, tinfoil and masking tape. I showed them my example, and explained the fabrication process. It was truly amazing to see how engaged and creative they were during the class period. 















Grades 6 and 7 worked in groups to brainstorm and sketch a design for a paint pendulum that would effectively create pendulum paint art. We watched a video of a successful paint pendulum in action and discussed the importance of gravity to the creation of pendulum paint art. The students had access to wooden dowels, cardboard tubes, rubber bands, string, masking tape, Styrofoam cups and paint bottles. The students were equally engaged in the creative design and building process as they were in creating their pendulum art. We had some great builds, and had some cool preliminary art made.

Health Office Reminders

Physicals- an updated physical is required every 4 years. If the student is participating in sports if must be updated every 13 months. If a student's physical expires during the sport season the student will be excluded from participation

All students entering kindergarten must be up to date on all immunizations, lead and have a current physical prior to the start of the school year.

All medications in the health office must be picked up by June 22. Medications not picked up will be discarded.

All medication orders must be updated yearly. All medications must be properly labeled and be brought to the school nurse by an adult, not the student.

All students entering grade 7 must have 2 varicella vaccines and a Tdap(tetanus,diphtheria,pertussis) prior to the start of school. Please forward any medical paperwork to the school nurse.

Per state regulations all students must be up to date on immunizations in order to attend school. All religious and medical exemptions must be updated yearly. **This is a new state regulation**. Please see exemption form on the health office website.


